The walk was approximately 16km (10 miles) mainly over a footpath route, passing through the rural outskirts of Thrybergh, Thrybergh Reservoir, Old Ravenfield and Ravenfield. Refreshments were available throughout the route and a special thank you to Ravenfield Parish Council and St James' Church for allowing us to use their facilities.

The whole of the school staff was involved in various roles: marshalling, supervising, providing refreshments and transport where required, plus a number walked with pupils at spaced intervals. This year your child will be raising money for Thrybergh Country Park to support water safety around the reservoir.


CHROMEBOOKS

ENGLISH

It's been a busy half term in the English Department, and we are so proud of how hard our students have worked.

In KS3, Year 7s have been completing a study of war, Y8s have been studying Shakespeare's Othello and Y9s have been studying Mary Shelley's Frankenstein. In KS4, Y10s have been studying J.B. Priestley's An Inspector Calls while the Y11s have been revising English Language, Paper 1 and An Inspector Calls in readiness for their mock exams in November.



This year, we have subscribed to Bookbuzz. Bookbuzz is a reading programme from BookTrust that aims to help schools inspire a love of reading in 11 to 13-year-olds. As a result of this, all Y7 & Y8 students have been given the opportunity to choose a book from a selection of 17 titles. The books are due to arrive in November, and once they do, students will be free to take their book home.

SEND MATHS

The students have started this first term back at school with a great attitude.

Year 10 and 11 have been continuing to work towards their GCSEs and have worked fantastically in this first term back.
