Keywords for this topic:



Peace—An absence of conflict.

Justice—When the right and fair thing is done.

War—When countries or other large groups of people use weapons to fight each other, the fight is called a war. Holy war—A war believed to be supported by God.

Just war—A war fought on certain philosophical and religious principles.

Pacifism—The belief of people who refuse to take part in war and any other form of violence.

Weapons of mass destruction— Weapons, like nuclear bombs, that cause a lot of damage and kill many people.

Violence—Using actions that threaten or harm others.

Terrorism—An action or threat designed to influence the government or intimidate the public. Its purpose is to advance a political, religious or ideological cause

Self-defence—acting to prevent harm to yourself or others.

Jihad—Literally means to strive or struggle. Lesser jihad refers to personal individual struggle against evil while following the way of Allah. Greater jihad refers to collective defence of the Muslim community.
